Jennifer Harbury: The 18 year struggle for Justice Continues in the Bámaca Case

GHRC hosts lawyer, activist, and author **Jennifer Harbury** to discuss the precedent-setting and paradigmatic case of her husband, Everardo Bámaca. She is cracking the walls of impunity in her fight to take military officials to trial for crimes committed during the war. Harbury continues to receive threats and needs YOUR support in the struggle for justice in Guatemala!

Bámaca, an indigenous leader of the guerrilla resistance, was captured, tortured and murdered by members of the Guatemalan military on the CIA payroll. Harbury began the search for her husband in 1992. After incredible persistence, two hunger strikes, and a decision by the Inter-American Court, Jennifer is now pushing the Bámaca case forward in Guatemala.

Harbury's international reputation is well earned; her tenacity, courage, and knowledge of international law has kept her alive and fighting for justice during the past 18 years.
